
We will be going on a day hike at Pinnacles National Park. Make sure you bring lots of water and properly fasten your backpack straps because it will be the hike of your life.

Scout Master Minute

Goals

Why are you in Boy Scouts? Is it to achieve the Eagle Rank? Is it to learn to be a Leader or to provide Service to others? Is it to have fun at our monthly outings, simply enjoying Scouts as a camping club? Is it to follow the Scout Oath and Scout Law and to do a Good Turn daily?

There are short term goals and long term goals in scouting.

Perhaps one of the longest goals is the pathway to the Eagle Rank which is laid out like a topographical map, complete with distances and minimum times, and elevation and steepness. The path is dynamic though. The longer you wait, the steeper the path gets. However, the steeps along the way do not change: the ranks, the skills, the merit badges, the service, the leadership, and finally the Eagle project.

The goals of learning to be a leader and providing service to others are fine goals and certainly decorate and adorn the pathway to Eagle. They are also ends in themselves. Aging out without making Eagle is by no means a failure if the young man has learned to become a leader and recognizes the good fortunes that he has and when it is time to share those fortunes with others.

Being in scouts to simply attend our outdoor events may seem like a shallower goal. Perhaps it is, perhaps it is not. The Outdoor Program is just as much a part of the Aims and Methods of Scouting as are Advancement, Leadership, and Personal Growth. Scouts do benefit and become better people simply from a hike in the woods, cooking in the outdoors, sleeping under the stars, and sitting around a campfire.

Following the Scout Oath and Law and doing a Good Turn daily helps you in achieving perhaps the longest and most difficult goal in all of scouting, that of being a good person. The achievements of Ranks and the memories of events can never be taken away from you. However, it is a struggle sometimes to be and continue to be a good person. People get tired, people get hungry, people get lonely, and people develop bad habits, even addictions such as drugs or alcohol, gambling or video games and make poor decisions because of those conditions.

Making Eagle at age 17 does not insure you will be a good person for the rest of your life, it is only a snapshot in time at the end of the Eagle trail. Likewise, one great act of service to others does exonerate other acts of disservice, however minor. To be a good person is a daily goal. Good habits, the right thoughts, the right speech, and the right actions, will make that daily goal easier. If you make being a good person your daily goal, then everything else will follow, school, sports, music, drama, family, scouts, and your Eagle rank.




